

## **FAQ's (Frequently Asked Questions)**

### **What is a Suffix?**

A Suffix is a one or two-digit account identifier. It is used to differentiate the different types of sub-accounts you may have, such as savings, checking, IRA, etc.

### **Will I need new checks or a new ATM or Visa Check card with this change to my account suffixes?**

No. Your account number and MICR (Magnetic Ink Character Recognition) number on your checks will not change. It will not affect your ATM, Visa Check or Visa Credit cards.

### **How does this affect me?**

The most significant change you will notice is when you access your account information through Shuttletalk. Some of your one-digit suffix numbers for account access will now change to a two-digit number. A list of the changed suffixes is recorded on Shuttletalk for your convenience. You will also see the changes reflected on PCU. Your Billpayer accounts will not be affected.

### **Why did you change the suffixes?**

By changing some of the suffixes to 2-digit numbers, KSCFCU will be able to open additional savings and checking accounts to meet your needs. You will continue to use your same main account number. This way you will not have to memorize multiple account numbers.

<u>EXAMPLE: Main Savings Account Number: 12345678</u>	<u>Suffix</u>
Main Savings	0
Vacation Savings	10
First Checking*	90
Hobby Checking *	91

\*For direct deposit and automatic debits to your checking, be sure to use the account number encoded on the bottom of your checks.
